

We are a 3K—8th grade Catholic School proudly serving New Berlin and 14 other surrounding communities.

We humbled and forever grateful by your support of our parish, school, and the outside charities that we support.



Home and School Fundraisers include Charger Chase and

Scrip Cards: almost \$54,000—These donations purchased new technology for our science lab and classrooms. They also support the ongoing school social events, programs, and classroom supplies that our Home and School Association generously funds.

School Education Fund (SEF): projecting over \$36,000—SEF is a tax deductible donation to help cover the gap between annual tuition and the actual cost of education.

8th Grade Legacy: over \$9,000—The Class of 2023 coordinated a number of fundraisers to renovate the school library and provide Wi-Fi extenders for the school.

The Parish and School Dinner Auction: almost \$200,000— to support our community, including over \$100,000 specifically designated to special school learning support initiatives.

Discipleship Wednesday Charities: over \$2,800 and countless cans of food and hygiene products supporting 11 unique charities picked by our teachers and students throughout the school year.

With the help of these donations, as well as the support of our very generous parish, we continue to make substantial investments in our student support, staffing, curriculum, and technology.

This year we made the following investments in our school:

- Three Learning Center teachers were hired, offering more individualized learning support.
- We added an additional 4K classroom, now offering three 4K classrooms in our PreK program.
- We welcomed a guidance counselor to our support staff.
- The middle school science lab received new high-end dedicated laptops for our science lab as we continue our awardwinning and unmatched STEM curriculum opportunities. With these laptops, our students utilize the latest version of Revit (architectural CAD software), Lego Spike software, Vex code V5 Robotic Software and Autodesk Tinkercad (3D design).
- We are continuing to invest in our reading programming for our younger grades. Our 4K-5th grade classrooms will be utilizing the CKLA reading and phonics program, piloted last year.

Our Mission calls us to advance the educational ministry of the Catholic Church by creating a compassionate atmosphere which develops faith, service, and academic excellence.

For over 125 years, Holy Apostles School faculty has dedicated itself to providing the best education for your children both spiritually and

academically. We offer a challenging curriculum, a variety of programs, and daily opportunities for faith –based reflection geared toward motivating students to become their best selves.

- Our teachers utilize state-of-the-art technology and resources to prepare our students for future careers and challenges. We have interactive displays in every classroom, laptops for every 4th-8th grade student, professional grade laptops for our middle school science lab to support our STEM program, and tablets available for 4K-3rd grade students for academic learning. Our school is equipped with a staffed Learning Resource Center designed to support reading and math needs as well as a fully stocked school library.
- We offer a comprehensive 4K—8th grade Spanish program designed to help students become proficient in their language use and cultural knowledge as they learn to effectively listen, speak, read, and write in Spanish.
- We are a 4K—8th grade STEM school, integrating Project Lead the Way into our science curriculum to provide opportunities for problem solving, teamwork, and innovative thinking at all levels. We are honored to be recognized as a 2022-23 Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Distinguished School! We are thrilled to be one of the few schools across the country to be awarded as both a Launch (4K-5th) and Gateway (6th-8th) distinguished school for our implementation of our Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math curriculum. This is our 5th year in a row earning the distinction in middle school and our 2nd year in a row earning the 4K-5th grade honor.



- Our Alumni frequently join us for service projects, volunteer opportunities, or even join our parish school staff!


We are proud of our results.

Our 2022-23 spring MAPS scores are summarized below:




2023 Math Maps Test Results
